Regular School Board Meeting Monday, April 20, 2015

7:00 pm - BAHS Community Room

The regular school board meeting was called to order by Chair Steve Eklund at 7:00 p.m. The Pledge of Allegiance was given.

Members present: Steve Eklund, Robert Hughes, Tony Cuda, Zane Braund, Angie Flowers,

Allison Londgren, Mike Thompson, and Supt. Gregory Winter.

Members absent: None.

Motion by R. Hughes second by M. Thompson to adopt the agenda with a clarification on Policy #421 - Gifts to Employees and School Board Members. Carried

Motion by T. Cuda, second by Z. Braund to approve the minutes of the March 16th Regular school board meeting; approve the April bills, \$189,109.80; accept the April Treasurer's report, and review the current enrollment analysis. Carried.

Under Open Forum - Braham Elementary Parent Organization Treasurer Sue Riesing presented a check to Board Chair Eklund for \$5,826. BEPO has a membership of about 24 parents providing opportunities for many to be involved in fundraising to help support field trips, other student activities, and staff appreciation meals. In the past, BEPO has donated \$22,639 to support those programs. Elementary staff is encouraged to share input about their needs and wishes. President Carrie Davis stated "we want other parents to be more aware of what we are doing". BEPO member Heather Sward asked if the board would like a monthly report from the group in order to be more transparent. Chair Eklund, Board members Braund and Thompson thanked them for all they do and encouraged them to report to the board through Elementary Principal Eklund's monthly board report. Chair Eklund stated "we want to hear your ideas. Our eyes and ears are open." He also thanked them for all they do for our students and staff. Monetary donations can come through the board so acknowledgement can be sent to BEPO of funds received.

Motion by M.Thompson, second by R. Hughes to acknowledge the April 2015 donations for the purposes requested: for sports \$50 value in towels from Helen Nestrud; for Power Mechanics - \$1,600 from MN Corn Growers and \$150 from VFW Rum River Post #2735; and, \$193 from the Wed evening Adult Volleyball players. Carried

Student Council representative RaeAnn Leaf reviewed the written report. Student Council and Nat'l Honor Society

members volunteers with Feed My Starving Children on March 25th; Highway Ditch Clean up will be in late April or early May; and, they continue discussion about suggestions for the Student Handbook as requested by high school administration.

Elementary Principal Jeff Eklund reviewed his written report. Earth Day activities scheduled for April 24th will include craft projects, speakers, and tree planting. Thanks to Angie Londgren for coordinating, BEPO for funding, and the many volunteers including the Braham Fire Dept. MCA testing is 4/20 through 5/4. Approximately 95 - 97% of parents attended conferences this spring.

Act Dir Shawn Kuhnke reviewed his written report, which included spring sports participation numbers and upcoming concerts. A huge thank you to the cast, crew and directors of the spring play "The Beverly Hillbillies" for the great job done. Thank you to JeanAnn Mattson and the prom committee for all their hard work for prom that was on April 18th. Luke Becker, VO Ag/IT instructor shared a video from the Nat'l Shell Eco Marathon SuperMileage competition. Braham SuperMileage team won the Spirit of Competition Award and a check for \$2,000. L. Becker also stated that Alexxis Fix and Montana Wagner won first place at State FFA Science fair in the SR Food, Science, and Technology team category.

HS Principal Matt Lattimore reviewed his written report. There was a presentation for 11th and 12th graders Friday before Prom. A state trooper spoke about distracted driving and a victim of a motorcycle accident shared his story. A school assembly was held for high school students encouraging them to do their best on the MCA tests over the next couple weeks. The hiring process is well under way for fall 2015.

District Assessment Coordinator Alli Marcus had no report this month.

Community Ed Director Cheryl Arnold reviewed her written report. Summer Youth Camp activities are being scheduled. State reports for Parent Aware recertification, School Readiness, Pathway II grant recertification and an ECE grant are complete.

Sup't. Winter's report to the board included updates on recent meetings and conferences attended. Insurance bid opening will be April 24th at 5 p.m. in B100. RRSEC has put their Rum River North facility plans on hold for a year as they continue the plan for building a new facility in Milaca. ECMECC continues their discussion on the development of the I-35 consortium offering college level courses. The Collaborative Committee plans to continue with shared funding of the Chemical Health Specialist. Sup't Winter gave his Bond Referendum powerpoint presentation to the Braham City Council. The legislature is still planning for the FY16 school funding. This will probably be on-going through June 2015.

Board members reported on individual meetings and activities attended. Among the events and meetings attended were conferences, a girl's basketball tournament, JO Volleyball games, the boy's basketball banquet, the district curriculum meeting, and meet and confer. "The Beverly Hillbillies" was enjoyed by many. R. Hughes shared Bond Referendum information at the Nessel Township meeting.

Rum River Coop Principal Meeting

The Coop brought in a Special Ed lawyer to go over special education law, present the changes to special education law and review past practices. Great seminar to become more familiar with all the parameters of special education law.

Making Meaning of Multiple Measures MDE

The students in 5th, 8th, 9th, and 11th grades take this survey every 3 years. Students are asked questions in four areas, Teaching and Learning, Interpersonal Relationships, Institutional Environment, and School Safety. The seminar walked us through the data and how to make meaning of what the students responses were. I am pleased to say that one of the take aways from the data for me is that our students feel that they are accepted by staff and other students, which translates to higher interest, good attendance, feeling safe and they have a sense of hope after high school.

Testing

Short of a few issues with technology, testing for the most part went off really well. Students were motivated and hopefully their scores will reflect their effort. We will be having a reward activity for the junior high students with bringing in the National Guard Obstacle Course for them to go through during their phy ed classes. Our 10th and 11th grade students names were given the incentive of cash. I will be drawing 10 names of students who proctors thought worked hard on their tests and they will be eligible for 20 dollars each.

Master Schedule

Students are now being scheduled for the 2015-16 school year. Conflicts with students schedules are being resolved on an individual basis. The schedule should be set for next year by the time school is out for the summer.

Awards Night

We had a great awards night on May 7th. Thousands of dollars in scholarship were given to our graduating seniors. Students were honored in all areas of their schooling, from academics, to fine arts, and athletics.

Graduation

Graduation planning is in full gear. Our senior advisors do a great job of getting all of the logistics taken care of. I am looking forward to that evening and sending the class of 2015 off on a high note!

Super-mileage

I attended the super-mileage state competition at Brainerd International Raceway. It was a great experience for me to see all of the hard work the students put into the cars. This is was all an eye opener for me to see and I am proud of the fact that we have this program for the students of Braham.
